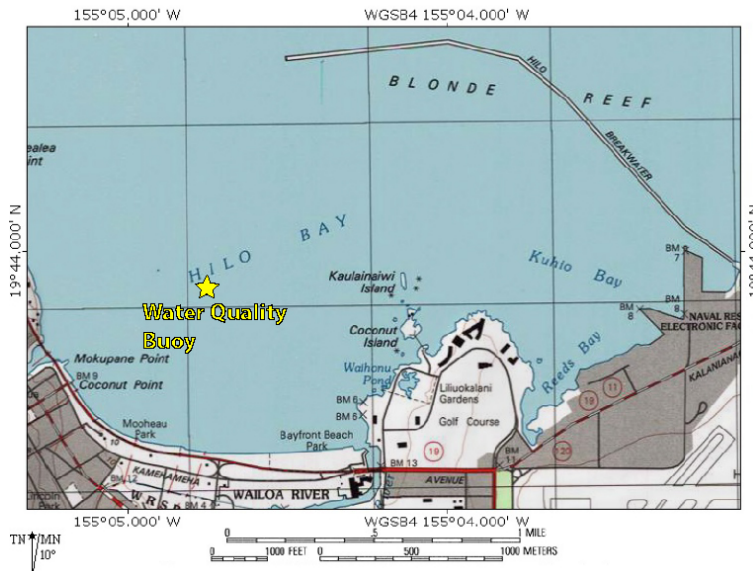
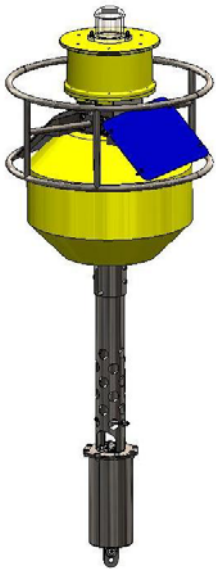


The Hilo Bay Watershed Advisory Group Presents

The Hilo Bay Water Quality Buoy: A New Community Resource

The UHH will deploy a water quality buoy in Hilo Bay to provide continuous, realtime water quality data for: salinity, temperature, dissolved oxygen, turbidity, nitrate concentration, pH, Chl a (phytoplankton). Data will be displayed at a public website and will be accessible for research, management and education. UHH will maintain the buoy but seeks community involvement by interested groups to ensure the safety of the buoy project.
